The Subtle Shades of Top Grain Leather

Leather Types:

Top Grain Leather

Hides can be split into two or three layers. Top Grain is the outside layer and most desirable and durable. The other layers are used to make corrected leathers and suedes.

Full Grain Leather

A leather in which the natural grain is still in tact and has not been altered in any way.

Nothing compares to real leather. The depth of its color, the feel of its many textures, the cool comfort, and outstanding durability make it one of the most desirable types of upholstery coverings today.

Leather is a multi-fibrous material and its thickness varies – even on different parts of the hide. The variation in thickness causes the hide to absorb dyes and tanning chemicals at different levels, which causes subtle variations in color.

This explains why the arm of a leather sofa or chair may have a slightly different shade than the cushions or the back. They were simply cut from different parts of the same hide.

Leather is a natural product that has incurred varying anomalies. These imperfections add individuality, making each piece of leather furniture uniquely appealing.

Leather Finishes:

Aniline – This dye permeates the hide completely producing delicate, soft, supple leather, but offers no protection from fading or staining.

Semi-Aniline – Utilizes aniline dye or stain to incorporate a small quantity of pigment without concealing natural characteristics.

Finished – Immersion dyed and coated for protection that creates outstanding durability for active families.
